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2016 SUMMARY ANNUAL REPORT FOR NORTHERN CALIFORNIA PIPE TRADES HEALTH AND WELFARE PLAN

This is a summary of the annual report of Northern California Pipe Trades Health and Welfare Plan (“Plan”), EIN 94-3183274, Plan 501, for the fiscal year ended June 30, 2016. The annual report (Form 5500) has been filed with the Employee Benefits Security Administration, as required under the Employee Retirement Income Security Act of 1974, as amended (ERISA).

The Board of Trustees of the Plan has committed itself to pay certain medical, hearing aid, dental, vision, jury duty and prescription drug claims incurred under the terms of the Plan.

Insurance Information

The Plan has contracts with Kaiser Foundation Health Plan, Inc., Blue Shield of California, Vision Service Plan, Principal Life Insurance Company, and Delta Dental of California to pay certain medical, vision, dental, life, and accidental death and dismemberment benefits incurred under the terms of the Plan. The total premiums paid for the Plan Year ending June 30, 2016, totaled \$47,017.813.

Basic Financial Statement

The value of plan assets, after subtracting liabilities of the Plan, was \$64,476,780 as of June 30, 2016, compared to \$60,672,325 as of July 1, 2015. During the Plan Year, the Plan experienced an increase in its net assets of \$3,804,455. This increase includes unrealized appreciation or depreciation in the value of Plan assets; that is, the difference between the value of the Plan’s assets at the end of the year and the value of the assets at the beginning of the year or the cost of assets acquired during the year. During the Plan Year, the Plan had total income of \$53,564,024, including Employer contributions of \$50,279,757, Participant contributions of \$2,147,935, earnings from investments of \$1,000,389, and other income of \$135,943.

Plan expenses were \$49,759,569. These expenses included \$2,079,985 in administrative expenses, and \$47,679,584 in benefits paid to Participants and Beneficiaries.

3. Assets held for investment;
4. Transactions in excess of 5% of Plan assets; and
5. Insurance information including sales commissions paid by insurance carriers.

If you request a copy of the full annual report from the Plan Administrator, these two statements and accompanying notes will be included as part of that report. The charge to cover copying costs given above does not include a charge for the copying of these portions of the report because these portions are furnished without charge.
